San Carlos City Wins Anew In SGLG

San Carlos City proved to have sustained its best practices in local governance as it won three times in a row the Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG) award for 2017.

The latest award was conferred to the city by the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) last November 27, 2017 at the Tent City, The Manila Hotel.

Tagged with said award are several opportunities for San Carlos City including access to Performance Challenge Fund and other program windows subject to specific guidelines among others.

San Carlos City passed the upgraded criteria for said local governance award for 2017 with the principle "4+1" covering the four core areas of Financial Administration, Disaster Preparedness, Social Protection, and Peace and Order plus the essential areas of Business Friendliness and Competitiveness, Environmental Management, and Tourism, Culture and the Arts.

DILG City Local Government Operations Officer (CLGOO) VI Nestor Garcia said that he was very happy with this year's outcome of the SGLG assessment citing that San Carlos City really deserved such commendation on its 3rd year as consistent recipient of said prestigious award since it pushed to improve more on its local programs and enhanced certain core areas.

Said award was received by San Carlos City Vice-Mayor Renato Y. Gustilo, Sangguniang Panlungsod Member Mark E. Cui and CLGOO VI Nestor Garcia.

San Carlos City won said award in three consecutive years from 2015 to 2017.

Other hall of fame awards conferred to San Carlos City were twice for Gawad Galing Pook Awards and regional and provincial categories as Best Performing City and Model Solid Waste Management Board.

San Carlos City for the second time was the recipient of the Red Orchid award last Nov. 23, 2017 at the Oriental Hotel in Tacloban City.

The city passed the criteria set by the Department of Health for implementing a 100% Tobacco-Free

Environment and that of the World Health Organization's "MPOWER" framework wherein the city garnered a total score of 91-100%.

San Carlos City Health Office (CHO) Nurse III Carlos Ramon Solidarios III said that the city's success in its advocacy for a 100% Tobacco-Free Environment was due to its strict implementation of the local anti-smoking ordinance especially in the prohibition of smoking area anywhere in the city and penalizing violators including the funding by the city government for the information-education campaign of the CHO in the amount of P200,000.

Captivating Caves of San Carlos

The city of San Carlos, though moving towards agro-industrialization is still a very rich agricultural land. Its total land area is classified to be 65 percent agricultural. Hence, San Carlos City is not just by nature covered with lush

Such, are the few but fascinating features of the caves in San Carlos City.

Caves Location

Among the 18 barangays of the city, 10 of it are actually mountain areas consisting of Barangays B a g o n b o n , Buluangan, Codcod, G u a d a l u p e , Nataban, Palampas, Prosperidad, Punao, Quezon, and Rizal.

Each of these barangays has a number of caves but some were not explored or not at all safe for exploration and thus, remained untouched. Some also bore stories of ancient times and remnants of World War II as these caves served as refuge to local Filipino families running and hiding away from the Japanese army then.

Presently, the city government of San Carlos has recognized the existence of

different forms and characteristics. Some are subterranean while other areas are really submerged in water. Some chambers have vivid wide gateways while a few maintained small entries whose admittance would reveal cathedral-like chambers at the core which could stir one's imagination of entering a portal to the other world.

these caves especially in the emerging tourism potential of the city as many local visitors have already gone through several sites for thrill and adventure even if these caves were not yet officially opened to the public.

A number of these caves though were already probed by experts and indeed, showed tourism potential.

Caves Classification

In August 11, 2017, Researcher and Archeologist Giovanni Bautista, also the Cultural Properties Officer and head of the Research Section of the National

Museum Cultural Properties Division assisted by representatives from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), Community Environment & Natural Resources Office, Provincial Environment Natural Resources Office and the San Carlos City Environment Management Office, visited the three largest caves in B-Quezon.

Though settled in private properties, Bautista classified the caves Sebache, Gui-Ob-Initihan and Kamangon of said barangay under Class 2 or semi-open caves which could be opened to the

protected forest areas which are home to wild birds and endemic trees but also endowed with numerous caves rich in mineral deposits and diverse flora and fauna.

Because of the city's unique agricultural profile, caves here have

public but for experienced cavers or guided educational tours only since these are not developed yet.

He also recommended that portions of these caves be temporarily or permanently closed to preserve its biological and historical values including the creation of cave management plan as provided by Republic Act 9072 or An Act To Manage And Protect Caves And Cave

Resources And For Other Purposes. He also assured the city government thru City Vice-Mayor Renato Gustilo that if the city government decides in creating a museum, their office is willing to give assistance.

Caves' Charming Features

Some people may not care about nature's way of shaping landscapes and hollow mountains but some are just fascinated at how caves came about. Most stories would even tag some mysteries to it.

No matter how cryptic the stories could be, it still do not interfere one's adventurous desires to explore or take a glimpse of these caves. It

even complements the bewildering interest of those whose souls are fascinated with the unknown and the supernatural.

There is more to the stories of San Carlos City caves when one could finally explore its beauty and charm. Common to these caves are enigmatic stalagmites and stalactites, but according to Bautista, although he has not seen any archeological component among these caves, there was a chunk of

fossilized wood present in one chamber, probably million years old which might be of interest to other group like the Mines and Geosciences Bureau of the DENR.

Caves Development

Seeing tourism as one effective tool in socio-economic development, the city government thru the City Tourism Office has already approved the Tourism Plan for San Carlos City featuring all tourism development areas including these caves.

Since most of the caves in San Carlos are not along the road, trail access development was seen to be the very first concern of the city government adding more thrill to cave enthusiasts' spelunking skill.

With the impending approval of the first three caves classification, City Mayor Gerardo P. Valmayor Jr during the latest meeting on Feb. 28, 2018, has already signaled thru the Tourism Office to start exploring other caves that show potential like the Tinungkuan Cave of Brgy. Prosperidad and Big King of Brgy. Palampas, among others.

Likewise, he also suggested that early trainings on caving and cave rescuing as well as engaging the community in tourism preparation be started in anticipation of the cave management plan.

As San Carlos City would soon become one of the leading tourist destinations in Negros Occidental province, the caves here, are just enticingly sitting, waiting to enchant the very firsts to kiss its ground.

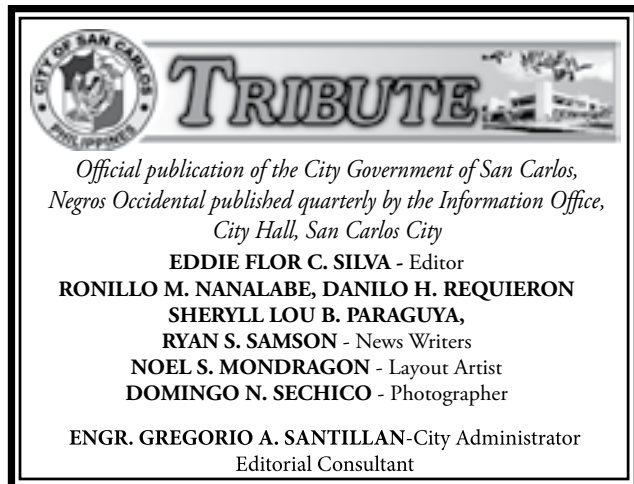


