Activities:

A. Country Program for Children:

I. Day Care Service Program

Services under the Day Care Centers include early childhood care and development, both mental and physical, supplemental feeding and parents' effectiveness service. Aside from the regular sessions conducted by the Day Care Workers to their pre-schoolers, they also observe and celebrate regular activities such as:

- A. Nutrition Month Celebration every July – cooking contest participated by the pre-school children and their respective mothers in coordination of their respective Barangay Council and the CSWDO.
- B. Family Week Celebration every September- participated by the respective family of the pre-school children in coordination of their respective Barangay Council and the CSWDO.
- C. Children's Month every October- draw & tell, singing contest participated by the pre-school children spearheaded by the CSWDO.
- D. Conduct of Sessions on Self- Enhancement and Parents Effectiveness Service Seminar to Day Care Service Parents Group.
- E. Conduct of Enhancement Training Skills for Day Care Workers- spearheaded by the CSWDO in order to update their skills and their distinct role in promoting the growth and development of our children.

2. Healthy Start Program

This program aims to support the growth of nurturing parent-child relationships, promote healthy childhood growth and development and to build strong families. Regular activities conducted such as:

- A. Family Assessment
 - B. Regular Group Session for Parenting Education
 - C. Home Visitation- conducted by the Family Support Workers
 - D. Conduct of Session on Self- Enhancement, Parents Effectiveness Service Seminar and ERPAT to partner family.
 - E. Celebration of Family Day.
 - F. Culmination Day of partner families after completion of the 3 year program
 - G. Team Building Seminar for the Family Support Workers together with their respective supervisors spearheaded by the CSWDO.
3. Supplemental Feeding for malnourished children

Supplemental Feeding (SF) is given to underweight pre-school children (not enrolled in the Day Care Centers) of low income families and to children who are in the borderline in order to correct the state of malnutrition. Every barangay has their respective feeding centers with a Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS) and Mother Volunteers. Pregnant/ lactating mothers were also served. Regular weighing and recording of the SF children enrolled in this program is properly done by the BNS together with respective Mother Volunteers to monitor the nutritional status of the SF children. Preparation of the actual feeding is regularly conducted by the SF children's mothers with the supervision of the BNS and Mother Volunteers.

B. Subsidy to Malnutrition and Rehabilitation Center

A subsidy of 33,210.00 is given for the Care and Rehabilitation of severely malnourished children admitted at the ward with one medical consultant regularly conducting medical check ups to admitted malnourished children.

C. Senior Citizen's and Veterans Affairs Program

As mandated by R.A. No. 9994 or the "Expanded Senior Citizen's Act of 2010", the office assisted the OSCA in its services particularly in the processing of the Local ID. For the year in review 1,448 Local Identification cards have been issued. A total of 6,918 Senior Citizen's issued with ID as of 2011

Activities:

- 1. Regular BOD meeting every 2nd Saturday of the month
- 2. Regular monthly general assembly every 1st Saturday of the month
- 3. Celebration of Elderly – 1st week of September
- 4. Symposium , trainings and seminars
- 5. Senior Citizen's & Veterans Night – October 30,2011

D. Medicare Para sa Masa

This program caters to those indigent families who are financially hard up to answer their hospitalization and other related medical needs. Every last quarter of the year, CSWDO

will conduct verification as to the economic status of every PHIC member for the purpose of renewal of membership. After the renewal, PHIC card distribution to the recipients follows. This year, a total of 8,926 indigents enrolled in the program with an amount of 5,355,600.00

E. Donations-Emergency Assistance

To meet the most urgent needs of distressed individuals facing crisis and multifarious problem, services ranging from financial assistance & emergency relief food rendered.

Cash disbursement as Aid to Individual in Crisis Situation (AICS) by the Office amounted to P 71,755.00 to individuals who were victims of fire, typhoon or even medical assistance to individual who is in dire need of help to help defray their medical expenses particularly those medical treatment cost much.

F. Operation of the Curfew Center

Activities:

1. Staff conducted Values Formation
2. Life Skills training activity
3. Seminars for parents of curfew violators
4. Family Day and spiritual upliftment seminar
5. Livelihood skills training
